

Genuine Student Requirement Assessment Form

What is GS?

The Government has replaced the Genuine Temporary Entrant (GTE) requirement for student visas with a Genuine Student (GS) requirement. This is effective for student visa applications lodged on and after 23 March 2024.

To be granted a student visa, all applicants must demonstrate that they satisfy the genuine student or genuine student dependent criterion. The Department of Home Affairs' website provides more information regarding the genuine student requirement.

International students applying to Raymond International College (RIC) must be genuine in their intention to study, comply with visa requirements, and successfully complete their courses at RIC.

Please ensure that you complete your GS criterion. You must limit the response to each question below to a **maximum of 150 words** only and provide evidence of any claims made in the statements below.
